The market will operate rain or shine unless severe weather poses a safety risk:

- Closed if a severe weather warning or visible lightning occurs during market hours
- Canopy take-down may be requested if wind speeds become unsafe

Cancellations before setup will be communicated by email.

Registration & Fees

Application period: Dec 21, 2024 – June 2, 2025 (early submissions encouraged)

- 1. Submit application via Google Forms.
- Pay \$25 application fee (non-refundable).
- Allow up to two weeks for application review. Detailed, complete information speeds approval.

Non-profits & sponsors: Application and space fees are waived (proof required).

Electricity & Generators

- **Limited electric hookups** for hot-food vendors (max 2/week). Specify need on application.
- **Portable generators** may be allowed with Market Manager approval.

Cancellations & Date Changes

- No refunds, but date changes may be arranged if requested by the Wednesday before your market date.
- No-call/no-show twice: space forfeited for the season
- **Date change requests:** Email roanokefarmersmarket@gmail.com with "Date Change Request" in the subject and both dates listed
- Waitlist: Be prepared to confirm and pay within deadlines if a spot opens

Vendor Guidelines

- Age: Vendors must be 18+ (or accompanied by guardian).
- **Setup:** Begins at 4 PM; complete by 5 PM (no vehicles on street after 4:45 PM).
- **Tear-down:** After 8 PM (unless weather requires earlier).
- Canopies: Weighted (min. 40 lbs) and within your booth footprint.
- **Displays:** Tables, signage, pricing clearly visible; stay within your allocated space.
- Noise & sanitation: No amplified sound; vendors must manage their own trash and leave the area clean.
- **Permits & compliance:** Adhere to Indiana, Huntington County, USDA, and any health-department requirements. Display required permits.
- Local products only: All goods must be grown/produced by the vendor in IN, MI, or OH.
- Pets & safety: No pets; maintain a safe environment for customers.

Acceptable Products

Agricultural (requires health permits)

- Fruits, vegetables, herbs
- Meat, poultry, fish
- Eggs, dairy, artisan cheese
- Apiary products, grains, seeds, nuts, maple syrup

Non-agricultural & Prepared Foods (requires HBV or health-dept permit)

- Baked goods, jams, pickles, beverages, roasted coffee
- Ready-to-eat items produced on-site

Artisans & Crafters

• Body care, candles, textiles, jewelry, art, photography, ceramics

Non-profits & Sponsors

Local non-profit organizations and official market sponsors

Health & Safety

- Provide proof of required permits and food-handler certificates.
- Follow all relevant state and local guidelines.
- Vendors are responsible for the safety and legality of their products.

Code of Conduct

All participants agree to:

- 1. Treat everyone with respect, courtesy, and honesty.
- 2. Maintain professionalism and a cooperative spirit.
- 3. Address any grievances to the Market Manager, not directly with other vendors.
- 4. Report hazardous conditions or conflicts immediately.
- 5. Refrain from aggressive, threatening, or offensive behavior.

Violations may result in probation or removal from the market.

Liability & Insurance

- Vendors are responsible for their own liability insurance.
- Roanoke Farmers Market and the Town of Roanoke are not liable for accidents, injuries, or loss.
